Lifeline reduces monthly phone charges so that the monthly bill is no more than \$15 for residential line; touch tone service, 911, and federal line charges, enabling customers to save at least \$7.00 on their bill. Link-up program provides eligible households with a waiver of charges normally associated with local telephone service connection and installation. Charges are waived for new service installation, moves from one residence to another, and reconnection of an existing service. Reduction or waivers of the deposit requirement may be available under the Link-Up program at the option of the telephone company. Free to eligible individuals. Eligible individuals must be in household that receives W-2, Medical Assistance, SSI, Food Stamps, Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program, WI Homestead Tax Credit or BadgerCare.
